ABSTRACT

Pima Community College's (PCC's) HOPES program engages Arizona@Work and a variety of employers in achieving two goals: 1) increasing opportunities for education, training, and supportive services that prepare TANF recipients and other low-income individuals to enter and advance in the healthcare sector; and 2) increasing the number of participants entering healthcare careers. Program activities include: 1) outreach and recruitment; 2) eligibility determination and randomized assignment; 3) development of an individualized plan for entering an educational program, complete with a career ladder/lattice; 4) provision of supportive services, including coaching, cognitive development, and noncognitive development; 5) experiential and/or clinical learning; 6) placement; and 7) reentry educational programming. The project offers training in the following programs/ career pathways: Behavioral Health Services (Psychiatric Aide), Dental Assistant, Medical Office Clerk, Medical Records Technician/Coding, Phlebotomy, Medical Lab Technician, Medical Assistant, EMT, Paramedic, Caregiver (bridge for CNA), Nursing Assistant, Patient Care Technician, Practical Nurse, Surgical Instrument/Sterile Processor, and Surgical Technologist. HOPES continues to support students active in pathways first supported in HPOG 1, including Health Information Technology Clinical Research Coordinator, Medical Coding and Records, and Pharmacy Technician. The project leverages diverse partners, including workforce investment organizations, community partners, and employers. Supportive services include holistic case management, academic advising, employment supports, tutoring, college readiness instruction, GED assistance, employment supports and training, and job search assistance. HOPES' partners include but are not limited to the TANF office (Rescare), the Pima County Workforce Investment Board, Arizona@Work, JobPath, and the Pascua Yaqui Tribe.
