ABSTRACT

Administered by the NetWORK Division of Zepf Center, the Northwest Ohio Pathway to Healthcare Careers (NOPHC) project is focused on empowering low-income individuals to obtain education and training needed for the healthcare field. NOPHC participants are given a Community Success Coach and an Education Success Coach, have access to Bridges Out of Poverty and Getting Ahead trainings, participate in "Healthcare 101" forums, have job shadowing and work experience opportunities, and receive basic skills education, among other program services. Project success is achieved through a variety of coordinated approaches that empower low-income individuals to enter and/or advance in the healthcare field through a holistic service delivery approach.

Occupational training is provided for the following: Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse, Physical Therapy Assistant, Surgical Technologist, Medical Assistant, Nurse Aide, Medical Records and Health Information Technician, Dental Hygienist, Dental Assistant, Community Health Worker, Emergency Medical Technician and Paramedic, Medical Insurance Coders, Medical Office Clerk, Health Technologist, Home Health Aide, Phlebotomist, Psychiatric Aide, Pharmacy Technician, and Human and Social Service Assistant. Coaches are employed by NetWORK and Lucas Metropolitan Housing Authority. Services that Zepf Center provides assistance for include: tuition and training, school supplies/materials, daycare, support services (e.g., assistance with transportation, food, housing), work supports, case management, vocational guidance, job development services, tutoring, community advocacy, and service bridging. Zepf Center partners with the local housing authority (Lucas Metropolitan Housing Authority), Lucas County Job and Family Services, and OhioMeans Jobs Lucas County Job Center. Zepf continues to receive consultation from the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services Apprenticeship Office in developing the apprenticeship for Peer Support, Chemical Dependency Counselor Aides, and Case Managers.
