

Revisions to the Refugee Arrivals Data System for Formula Funds Allocations (ORR-5)

Dear Colleague Letter 23-14

Dear Colleague:

This Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) describes changes to the Refugee Arrivals System (RADS) for Formula Funds Allocations (ORR-5), effective October 1, 2022.

The ORR-5 data provides invaluable information regarding populations enrolled in, Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA), Refugee Medical Assistance (RMA), and Refugee Support Services (RSS) and in receipt of, Refugee Medical Screening (RMS) services. This data makes a critical contribution to ORR's ability to assess cash and medical assistance utilization and the services provided.

I. Notification

States must ensure that clients understand that information collected, such as their name, Alien number, date of birth, nationality, migration status, services utilized, English language ability, education level, and Family Self-Sufficiency Plan (FSSP) goals will be submitted to ORR.

II. Timing of Base Funding Allocations and the Matching Process

To expedite the RSS allocation process, ORR is changing the timeline in which it matches statesubmitted data against federal records. In FY 2023, ORR will use state-submitted data to determine RSS base funding prior to performing the match process. ORR will validate the data (such as checking it for duplicate Alien Numbers) prior to use for funding allocations.

Later each year, ORR will perform the traditional matching process with federal sources to reconcile the data submitted by the states. This reconciliation will then be used to determine allocations for RSS and set asides for the subsequent fiscal year. In instances where ORR over- or under- allocated RSS during the previous year, ORR will adjust its current year allocation (in this case FY 2024) based on the reconciled match data.

The shift to conducting the traditional matching in the subsequent fiscal year will allow ORR to issue a DCL announcing the full-year RSS base funding amounts earlier than previously issued which we hope is

helpful to states in their contracting and service planning for the coming year. In addition, this shift is necessary given current delays in data sharing from federal sources that support the match process.

It is important that states continue to submit quality data despite funding allocations being determined prior to performing a match process. State-submitted data will still undergo the traditional matching process, which will then be used to determine future funding allocations.

Based on recent reporting accuracy (over 95%), we anticipate any reconciliations to be minimal in the subsequent fiscal year.

The submission period for FY 2022 data closes on January 17, 2023, and on January 18, 2023, a snapshot of the submitted data will be taken and used for the reconciliation process to determine future RSS allocations.

III. Updates to the Revised ORR-5

A. Revised ORR-5 data fields

ORR has expanded the ORR-5 to include additional data fields and has divided it into three sections. Section I includes demographic and service data. Section II includes questions regarding RSS FSSP primary goals and referrals, and Section III includes RSS FSSP follow-up questions to be administered 12 months after an individual has been enrolled into RSS.

The following table lists all the data fields by section and indicates which fields are included in both versions of the ORR-5 and which are new to the revised ORR-5.

- 1. FY 2023 Submission: Section I for individuals served during FY 2022; Section II for individuals with an FSSP who enrolled during FY 2022; no Section III submission.
- 2. FY 2024 Submission: Sections I & II for individuals served during FY 2023; Section III for individuals with an FSSP who enrolled during FY 2022 based on the previous year Section II submission.
- FY 2025 Submission: Sections I & II for individuals served during FY 2024; Section III for individuals with an FSSP who enrolled during FY 2023 based on the previous year Section II submission.
