

Afghan Refugee Support Services Supplement: FY 2023 Legal Assistance Allocation

Dear Colleague Letter 23-20

Dear Colleague:

The Afghanistan Supplemental Appropriation Act, 2022, and Additional Afghanistan Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2022 ("ASA") provided the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) with specific appropriations to provide benefits and services to the citizens or nationals of Afghanistan delineated in ORR Policy Letter (PL) 22-11, Afghan Populations Eligible for ASA-Funded ORR Services. This Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) outlines the FY 2023 ASA allocation to states¹ for Refugee Support Services (RSS) base funding specifically for immigration-related legal assistance for eligible Afghan populations, which totals approximately \$56.2 million.

Funding Formula and Allocations Chart

The FY 2023 ASA Legal Assistance Allocations chart below displays the FY 2023 ASA RSS base funding for legal assistance and the "Number of People" used to determine the allocations. To arrive at the "Number of People" totals, ORR used the number of Afghan Humanitarian Parolees who have arrived in each state, as recorded in the Hummingbird database, submitted by states through the FY 2022 Refugee Data Submission System for Formula Funds Allocations and Service Analysis (ORR-5) process, and data from the Department of State.

States that had fewer than 20 APA arrivals did not receive an ASA Legal Services allocation in FY 2022². These same states will not receive an allocation in FY 2023. In addition, five states confirmed they do not require a FY 2023 allocation for Afghan Legal Assistance. Funds that otherwise would have been allocated to these states will be added to the total available FY 2023 ASA RSS base funding.

¹ The term "states" throughout this DCL refers to states and replacement designees (RDs) that receive RSS funding from ORR.

² Other resources through ORR discretionary grants and other funding mechanisms will be available in areas where ASA-funded RSS legal assistance is not available

As required under ORR regulation 45 C.F.R. §400.210, these funds must be obligated by September 30, 2024, and liquidated by September 30, 2025.
